

## The differences between colostrum, transitional milk and mature milk

## Colostrum

**Colostrum** can be defined as the mammary secretion ingested by newborn piglets until 24 hours after the birth of the first piglet.

## **Transitional milk**

**Transitional milk** is defined as the mammary secretion produced from 34-36 hours after birth and up to 10 days of lactation, although the most important changes in transitional milk occur up to 72-96 hours of lactation.

## **Mature milk**

On the other hand, **mature milk** is defined as the milk secreted from the 10th day of lactation until the end of lactation, because its composition is essentially constant during this period.
